

learning from friends who help you on your way.




EARLY PICKUP REMINDER!

This term, students in Rooms 3 & 4 have started looking at Design and Technologies and making strong structures. They have learnt about different materials and shapes used in building design. In small groups, students then were given a design challenge. They had limited resources to try and make the tallest, freestanding structure. Before they started the building process, they had to work with their group to brainstorm and sketch out designs. This week we have started the building process. Next week, we will be finishing their builds and testing to see how strong they are using a shake table (earthquake simulation).
