From the Principal's Desk...

Dear Parents,

This term we have commenced the review of our Site Improvement Plan priorities as part of our annual review. We have been pleased to see the number of students meeting standard of Educational Achievement has increased and students are achieving higher bands in Mathematics and English.

I am pleased to be sharing our NAPLAN and PAT (Progressive Assessment Tests) results in Maths and Reading have improved. I feel quite proud to share that our students are making growth and we are closing the gap between our Aboriginal and Non Aboriginal students. Our data shows that this year our school has made the highest growth in NAPLAN scores across all schools. This is something we all need to be proud of and I commend the staff and the students for all their hard work.

At Governing Council next week we will discuss and approved the material & services fees for next year. The proposal will be that in 2023 the fees will be \$269 for the year.

The preschool to school transition started on Tuesday and we are excited to have 25 students starting with us in 2023. Many of these children transition from our Child Parent Centre but we are thrilled to have 9 children joining us from other preschools within our community. Kindy Transitions are taking place at the same time.

We continue working on our class lists for the next year. This process takes a number of weeks to complete while all classroom combinations are considered. This involves taking into account student friendships, academic needs, as well as social and emotional requirements. If you have requests regarding your child's placement for 2023 you are urged to write to me **before Monday 17th November**. Requests for individual teachers will not be considered.

Tomorrow our Early Years classes and our Pre School are going on an excursion to see the "Hiccup" Performance at Lea Theatre. It is great that we are able to provide these opportunities for our students once again.

Finally, I would like to thank families who have been working with us to help their child(ren) get back on track after the holidays. Regular routines help students learn their boundaries and as role models we need to work together to help them find the strength to be sensible, choose kindness and to do the right thing in unsafe situations; especially when there are unsupportive influences around them. If children see us modelling together then it is more likely that they will choose the right option and make positive choices.


