What a busy week we've had!

Sports Day

Unfortunately Sports Day has been cancelled for a second time due to adverse weather. This event will now take place in Term 4 in an attempt to seek better weather conditions.

Student Free Day

On Monday, whilst students enjoyed an extra day at home, teachers were involved in training around the assessment of student work and moderation as part of the Department for Education's focus on 'Learning Design, Assessment and Moderation' (LDAM). This opportunity deepened teachers' understandings of assessment and the Australian Curriculum Achievement Standards (which is what all teachers report to). Teachers engaged in moderation; which is the process whereby they make sure the grades assigned to student learning is consistent and in alignment to the Australian Curriculum - across classrooms, grade levels, and more broadly the school and other schools across Australia. Ancillary staff participated in training in relation to spelling strategies to assist students with writing in the classroom. Preschool staff continued to build their understanding of content and strategies to develop children's mathematical knowledge and language. It was a beneficial day for all staff

Year 7 is moving to High School in Term 1, 2022

You may have heard our year 7's will be moving to high school in Term 1, 2022. This means that if your child is in year 5 or 6 this year, they will graduate from primary school next year, 2021. Department for Education has been planning this for some time and we have identified important issues for consideration; such as staffing implications, facilities and budgeting ready for 2022. We would like to reassure families we will provide further information as plans for the move progress.

No Jab No Play in the Preschool

Many thanks to the families of our preschool children for providing us with your child's current up to date immunisation records. A new law came into effect last Thursday 6th August, whereby any child who attends an early childhood service after this date must have all age appropriate vaccines. However, on Friday we received correspondence from the Department, that the Chief Public Health Officer recognises that for some communities, while children may well be immunised, for a range of reasons it has been difficult to immediately obtain immunisation records. Therefore, an additional 6 week extension was approved for any children in the care of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Guardianship to provide immunisation records to the preschool.


We are in need of pre-loved school uniforms for our emergency stock pile that we can use for students when accidents arise.
